When We Started

Fernside grew out of Rachel and Paul Burrell's experience with grief following the death of their son. David.

While attending a grief support group, Rachel realized that she was not alone in wondering why there was no grief

support for children and teens in our community.

In the fall of 1986. Fernside opened its doors to 16 children and 12 adults. Their credo evolved - a safe and loving, nonjudgmental haven for grieving children and teens. Rachel said, "We would learn from the children and they would create the place."

Fernside is the name of a street near Walnut Hills **High School**, where David attended. When David was a student and needed a ride home, he would say, "Meet me at

Fernside."

Today, hundreds of children, teens and adults attend support groups annually. Our services have expanded and now include community outreach, crisis response, in-school groups, camps, training and consultations.

What We Do

Evening Program

We offer support groups for families with children ages 3-18, who are grieving the death of a family member or friend. Children and teens are divided into groups with others close to their age, while their parents/guardians meet with each other at the same time.

School Program

We offer time-limited groups, on-site, during the school day, at area elementary, middle and high schools.

Crisis Program

We provide support to schools and other organizations following a death. We can provide consultation as well as on-site support for faculty, students and staff.

Special Collaboration Program

We serve children and adults with special needs or in special settings. We collaborate with schools and social service agencies to ensure grief support is available and accessible to everyone in our community.

Camp Program

We offer an annual summer day camp for children ages 3-8, an annual summer camp for children ages 7-12 and a springtime retreat for teens ages 13-18.

Community Outreach & Education

We provide information about our history and services as well as presentations on a variety of grief-related topics.
