

Fernside has provided grief support for students in the Mason City School District for the past 19 years. We've offered 71 groups in that time and most recently, held a group for Mason High School faculty who had experienced their own losses. We're proud to have partnered with over 60 local school districts to expand our reach and want to thank Mason City Schools for trusting Fernside with their family support needs.
